The Juniata County Commissioners met on the above date with Commissioners Alice Gray, Todd Graybill, and Mark Partner present. Also in attendance in the meeting room was Juniata Sentinel reporter Becky Lock. Participating via WebEx conference call were Mifflin-Juniata Human Services Director Allison L Fisher and one unidentified member of the public.

The meeting was called to order at 10:00 a.m. by Chairperson Gray. A moment of silence was observed followed by the Pledge of Allegiance. On a motion by Graybill and a second by Partner, the Minutes of the January 18, 2022 meeting were unanimously approved as submitted.

During public comment, the following individuals spoke:

- Allison Fisher shared an update regarding the Low Income Household Water Assistance Program (LIHWAP). The program provides one-time payments to both renters and homeowners with past due water or sewer bills. Payments to eligible individuals will be made on a first come first serve basis.
- Commissioner Gray provided information regarding a free COVID testing site at Cedar Grove Brethren In Christ Church located at 287 Deerville Road Mifflintown, PA 17059. Drive-through testing will be available Tuesday, January 25th through Friday, January 28th from 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. and Saturday, January 29th from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. Walk-in testing will be available from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. Tuesday through Friday. NO appointment necessary.
