**EMERGENCY JUDICIAL ORDER**

AND NOW, March 17, 2020, in accordance with the Order of the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania authorizing the Court to declare a Judicial Emergency in the 41<sup>st</sup> Judicial District of Pennsylvania, I do hereby declare that a Judicial Emergency exists in this Judicial District and shall continue to exist until April 14, 2020, due to COVID-19.

Consistent with the foregoing declaration, **IT IS HEREBY ORDERED** as follows:

1. Time calculations for the purposes of time computation within this Judicial District for the filing of documents with the Court or taking other judicially-mandated action are hereby suspended beginning March 17, 2020, up to and including April 14, 2020.
2. Without limiting any computations referred to in the previous paragraph, the operation of Rule of Criminal Procedure 600 is hereby suspended for the duration of this Judicial Emergency, and the time period of this Judicial Emergency shall be excluded from the time computation under Rule of Criminal Procedure 600(C).
3. The use of advance communication technology is hereby included to permit the conduct of Court proceedings including by not limited to those proceedings specified under Pennsylvania Rule of Criminal Procedure 119(A)(1)(5)(6)(7).

4. This Court may exercise or implement all other special powers granted and authorized under Pennsylvania Rule of Judicial Administration 1952(B)(2).
5. This Order has been transmitted to the State Court Administrator's Office and the Prothonotary of the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania and is effective immediately.
